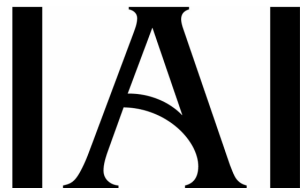
Course outline:

The course will focus upon the writing and editing for publication of archaeological excavations and archaeological surveys. The course is structured around four presentations. Two of the presentations are designed to best advise the practising archaeologist on how to take 'grey literature' and write it to a suitable publication standard (Dr. Elizabeth Fitzpatrick and Frank Coyne). The two remaining presentations will address relevant issues relating to the successful editing of a document to publication standard and the function and role of the editor (Jerry O'Sullivan and Paul Gosling). Each of the trainers will use appropriate case studies. The
